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
#### Photographers

#### Miyazaki Daihido (Miyazaki Shokannon Zazo)

The Kannondo building was built in 1267. This is a sacred place where funeral rituals were once held in its grounds. Inside is a 1-meter high seated statue of Kannon (Goddess of Mercy).

#### Tohoku Electric Power Okuaizu Suiryoku Museum MIORI®

Learn about the mechanism of hydropower generation, the history of power development in the Tadami River basin, and renewable energy.



## Nakagawa Onsen (Fukushi Center Yuyukan)

A quiet local hot spring just a 3-minute walk from Aizu-Nakagawa Station. A place of relaxation for local residents with a strong community feeling. Get smooth skin by bathing in the water here.

# A secluded valley area




#### Hvottoko Tei

A popular and unique noodle restaurant in the area. The "Gorocha-men noodles" with its large, soft chunks of chashu pork is why people come here.

# Aizu-Kosugawa Station

The waiting area is loved by the local community and is decorated with commemorative photos from the neighborhood senior citizen's association.



#### Niko Shrine

Cross the railroad crossing in front of Aizu-Kosugawa Station. Its name comes from the same word as the famous place "Nikko". The main building of the shrine was used as a stage, and it is said that in the past, local theatrical performances were held there.

#### Takizawa River Potholes

A pothole is a circular hole formed by water flow in a river bed or on rocks along the river bank. You can view strange rock formations created by nature. (Be careful, it's slippery!)



#### **Kumano Shrine and** Daigongenshimizu

# Takizawa Onsen (Minshuku Matsunoyu)



**Unatari Shrine** and Oshio no Rosan (Oshio's Old Cedar Tree

The "Oshio no Rosan" tree at the entrance is over 500 years old. Two unassuming guardian dogs guard the shrine.



#### Oshio Onsen Communal Bath

A lukewarm carbonated hot spring bath. The carbonic acid effect promotes blood circulation and is said to be a "water for beautiful skin." There is also an open-air bath that overlooks the Tadami River.

Bathing fee: From 300 yen Hours: 7:30-20:00 (November to March 8:30-20:00) Closed: Open 7 days a week



# Oshio Natural Sparkling Water Field

A well of carbonated water that has been flowing since the old

days. In 1905, it was exported to Europe in ceramic bottles. It is protected and maintained by the local community.



#### Okuaizu Kaneyama Natural Sparkling Water

This natural sparkling water is pumped up from underground, the iron content removed and bottled for a refreshing drink. It is sold at the roadside station (P7), Seseragi-so Onsen (P10) and Kaneyama Town Tourist Information Center (P9).
